By considering the benefits and potential dangers of the internet. By discussing the moral implications of cyber bullying and the consequences of different courses of actions in response to online scenarios.	By producing work that reflects the needs of diverse audiences within our community and the wider community, e.g., desktop publishing and podcasts. By highlighting ways to stay safe when online. By promoting good etiquette habits when using digital technologies and social media, with links to pupils' digital wellbeing. By discussing the impact of using technology on the ways people communicate and helping pupils express themselves clearly. By encouraging collaborative learning through paired and group activities.	By teaching children how to be sensible users of technology. By developing a sense of awe and wonder at human ingenuity.
